Ngutunui Hillclimb **SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS**

1. JURISDICTION

This event is a Hillclimb promoted by the **Hamilton Car Club** and will take place on **Sunday 10th of March 2019** in the Otorohanga/Pirongia area. This is a ClubSport advanced status event.

The event will consist of a practice run, then a minimum of 3 timed runs up the 8.7km Hill known as "Ngutunui Hill". Fastest time from any one of 3 timed runs will determine the Hillclimb winner for the day. Organisers may allow extra unofficial runs if time permits, which will not count towards the overall results.

To be held under these Supplementary Regulations, the MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its Appendices and Schedules particularly Appendix 5, Schedule C being the Standing Regulations for all ClubSport Events and Appendix 2, Schedule A Driver Safety and Vehicle Requirements.

4. **ENTRIES**

These open with the publication of these regulations.

Normal entries will close at 5.00pm, Thursday 2nd March 2019

Late entries will close at 8.00am on Sunday 10th March 2019.

Entries to be made on the MotorSport NZ online entry system and to be deemed valid must be complete in all details and the appropriate fees paid to Hamilton Car Club account.

Acceptance will be at the organising committee's discretion.

Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with the prescribed provisions of the National Sporting Code.

B. *Number of Starters:*

The organisers reserve the right to abandon the event if less than 30 entries are received at normal closing date. The maximum number of starters will be 55. Any additional entries received after the normal closing date, will be included at the organisers discretion.

C. *Acceptance of Entry:*

Acceptance of entry will be at the absolute discretion of the organisers.

Where more entries than the maximum are received up to closing of normal entries, preference will be given to Hamilton Car Club members.

Late entries will be a first come-first served basis.

Please check the website Hamiltoncarclub.org.nz for event updates and information from time to time.

D. *Competitor Requirements:*

In signing the entry forms competitors (Entrant and Drivers) are deemed to fully understand MotorSport NZ Inc, National Sporting Code and its relevant Appendices and Schedules. In particular the National Sporting Code articles pertaining to protests and competitor's obligations.

- A current Car Club Membership

- A Protective Helmet conforming to Motorsport New Zealand Inc. specifications
- Clean protective overalls and footwear conforming to Motorsport New Zealand Inc specifications. (Refer Appendix Two, Schedule A)

E. Licence Requirements:
 Driver must hold a Club Sport M Grade License higher.
 All drivers must attend the briefing at **8.40am** on Sunday 10th March at the venue.

F: Passengers allowed in cars with suitable roll cages, safety harness and wearing appropriate safety gear (overalls and helmet) at the DISCRETION OF THE CLERK OF COURSE.
 Competing drivers may not participate as a passenger.
 All passengers must sign an indemnity form on the start line of each run.
 Passengers must be over 12 years of age and if less than 16 years of age must have signed consent of parent or have a restricted Competition License.

5. ELIGIBLE VEHICLES

All vehicles must conform to the vehicle safety regulations contained in Appendix Five, Schedule C, 4.1. Non-registered vehicles will be allowed to compete but must not travel on any section of road outside of the road closure. For more information, refer to section 14, General.

Roll cages are not compulsory to enter this event, but non-roll caged vehicles will only be accepted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course prior to the closing of normal entries.

Non-roll caged vehicles will not be accepted for scrutineering on the day of the event without prior approval of the Clerk of the Course.

Turbochargers are not restricted.

Vehicle conforms to Schedule A specifications.

All tires must be dot approved types, in a road legal condition.

7. DOCUMENTATION AND SCRUTINEERING AUDIT

Competitors must present themselves at documentation for the checking of licences and documents, issuing of competition numbers prior to presenting the car for audit scrutineering.

Cars will not be cleared to compete until all of these numbers are firmly affixed in the appropriate places on the vehicle.

The venue for this will be **Hamilton Car Club Rooms, 116 Vaile Road, Newstead.**

From 3pm until 5pm on Saturday 9th March.

For out of town competitors: **Ngutunui School (event venue)**

From 7.00am until 8.00am, on Sunday 10th March.

Competitors must notify organisers if you are unable to make the Saturday scrutineering.

8. OFFICIALS IDENTIFICATION

Officials of the event will be identified as detailed below.

- (a) Marshals: **Orange bibs with Black writing**
- (b) Scrutineers: **White name badges**

9. OFFICIAL BULLETINS

May be issued in accordance with the provisions of the National Sporting Code.

10. OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARDS

These will be located at the following venue:

11. RESULTS

Provisional results will be posted on 10th March at Ngutunui School or at the Hamilton Car Club, Vaile Rd, Hamilton (location will be advised by organisers on the day). If possible organisers will post times after each run.

12. SPECTATOR PROVISIONS

There are no spectator points at this event.

13. EVENT DIRECTIONS

Refer to map located at the end of these regulations. Competitors should turn from Ngutunui Rd into Pekanui Rd where a gate to the left will provide access to the service park (Ngutunui school) approx 50m from the intersection.

Ngutunui School are having their usual breakfast and lunch food available for purchase throughout the day please support this as they support our club to be able to use this road. This is a great fundraiser for them.

14. **GENERAL**

- a) Food and drinks will be available at the service park.
- b) No dogs or alcohol at the venue.
- c) Please collect all rubbish in the interest of good MotorSport public relations
- d) All competitors to supply and service on a ground sheet within Ngutunui School grounds.
- e) Servicing is only permitted in the designated service park at Ngutunui School.
- f) All competitors will be required to pay for any fencing or property damage costs incurred within seven days of the fencing account being presented. Where multiple competitors go off in the same section of fence, repair costs will be divided evenly between the competitors.
- g) On release of these regulations any competitor seen travelling the course before the start of the event will be excluded from the event and fined in accordance with NZ MotorSport Manual no. 36.
- h) DUAL DRIVERS: Dual driver vehicles will be allowed, but there may only be one group of cars allowed to tour back through the stage at the completion of each run (depending on time available). For dual driver vehicles it will be the competitors responsibility to get the vehicle from the end of the course back to the start for the second driver to compete. If vehicles are unregistered or have no w.o.f then they must be trailered back to the start in time for the second driver to compete. Dual driver competitors must make themselves known to event organisers at documentation to receive suitable starting numbers.
- i) STARTING ORDER: Starting order will be posted on the Hamilton Car Club Bus as soon as possible after drivers briefing. Competitors must start in numerical order to be allowed to complete each run. No allowance will be made for competitors that fail to present themselves in the correct starting order unless arranged with the Clerk of the course.
